Rtn. Deepak Talwar has been a member of the Rotary Club of Delhi Chanakyapuri since 1980. PAKISTAN RELATED ACTIVITY:

1. A highlight of rotary year 2005-2006 with Deepak as Governor was special friendship treaties signed with R.I. District 2420 in Turkey and R.I. District 3270 in Pakistan. These treaties have resulted in a spate of matching grants between the concerned districts for new community service projects in the mentioned districts and in our district 3010 New Delhi India.
2. During the major Earthquake in Pakistan Northern regions in September 2005, then Governor Deepak Talwar along with good friend and batch mate governor Faiz Kidwai of Pakistan District 3270 were first off the line organizing massive relief aid by sending blankets, mineral water, housing tents to the disaster areas through assistance of Pakistan High Commission in Delhi. This was also reported

- in the Rotarian magazine soon thereafter in an article on the disaster and rotary relief efforts.
3. A Conflict resolution conference was held in June 2006 at Islamabad where Deepak was Chairman of same along with Rtn Navaid Khan of Karachi Pakistan. The conference was attended by fifty Rotarians from India and over one thousand Rotarians in Pakistan. The conference was addressed by the then political leadership of Pakistan as well as Mr Shiv Shankar Menon then Indian High Commissioner to Pakistan and now Foreign Secretary of India;
 4. There have been numerous international friendship exchange delegations between the mentioned districts thereby celebrating the platform of rotary in multifaceted ways.
 5. Currently a mega project is being planned to set up a state of art blood bank in Karachi Pakistan with assistance from the rotary blood bank in New Delhi to give substance to the rotary ethos of PEACE BETWEEN INDIA AND PAKISTAN
 6. THROUGH COMMUNITY SERVICE. Deepak is in the vanguard of this project and hopes to see it through in the next couple of rotary years.
 7. In 2006-2007 Deepak was Chairman of Pakistan Desk as a part of the South Asian Countries Goodwill Peace conference held in India for second time since 1982. He ensured that despite hurdles, over 200 Indian visas were issued to Pakistani Rotarians to enable them attend the Goodwill conference.
 8. In February 2007 Deepak accompanied then R.I. President Elect Wilf Wilkinson to portion of Kashmir in Pakistan to oversee Earthquake relief temporary constructions work along with then Pakistan Rotarian leadership. It was during this visit that Rotary International was honored by the highest civilian award of Pakistan by then Pakistan President.
 9. Deepak has been to Pakistan many times since 1989 and addressed many Rotary meetings at club and district level there. He sees himself as a harbinger of rotary peace and goodwill between the two erstwhile nuclear armed hostile neighbouring countries. He is close to and well known to all echelons of Pakistan Rotarian leadership. The incoming district governors for next three years are personal friends of Deepak and have either stayed at his home in New Delhi or visited India courtesy his efforts to provide them all kinds of facilitations including Indian visas and accommodation.
 10. Since Deepak Talwar forefathers come from areas now in Pakistan, he is treated almost as a Pakistani national with bonhomie and camaraderie further being enhanced through deeper associations and friendships using the Rotary platform of service and fellowship.
 11. Initiated and implemented Matching Grant Projects over 1million US Dollars toward community services projects and Flood/Earthquake devastated villages in Pakistan
 12. Actively involved in promotion of peace dialogues and understanding between Political leaders in India and Pakistan for peace in sub-continent.

As a hobby, Deepak likes to sing semi classical hindi film and folk songs. He has sung on All India radio and also performed on stage at various rotary and non rotary platforms. He has acted on television and performed as an actor in various stage plays during his college days. Deepak has given vocal musical performances in Pakistan on some Rotary platforms on overwhelming Rotarian requests.
